


Let's Talk About Architects!

Who is Patricia Galván?

Patricia Galván is a commercial and interior project architect in California. After going through school and the process of licensure, Patricia found her love for the smaller details of architecture and the construction process. Her career has given her many opportunities within her community, and she has taken advantage of this to advocate for women in the profession.

Here is what's special about Patricia Galván :

- Patricia is very passionate about architecture, but she believes that you need other outlets to take your mind away from the stressors of the profession
- Patricia knew that through architecture she could add a bigger impact to her community.
- After working at both small and large firms, Patricia decided that small firms were more efficient and beneficial to her career, so she has stuck with these smaller firms!

Who is Farida Abu-Bakare?

Farida Abu-Bakare is a Nigerian Canadian leader in the field of Architecture. Seeing the lack of representation and support for women in the field, Farida decided early on that she wanted to be the figure and support for other young women in architecture someday. Her hard work through her education and early career led to being an Associate and licensed Project Architect at HOK. She then moved on to be Director of Global Practice at WYX, a firm in New York.

Here is what's special about Farida Abu-Bakare:

- While pursuing her Masters, Farida had her mind set on 3 firms to work for. After many rejections she finally got hired on by one called HOK!
- Farida ended up founding BAIDA (Black Architects and Interior Designers Association) to promote diversity and inclusion in the profession.
- Farida credits her success in the field to her tenacity and acceptance of failing, being in the uncomfortable parts that allow you to grow and become stronger.

Who is Maia Small?


Maia Small is a well-rounded architect, from developing her own firm to teaching at universities like Harvard, she has seen it all! Today, she has found her calling as an urban planner in California. After many trips around the country, Maia saw how architecture and design affects the surrounding town, this led her to discover Urban Planning. Maia has been working within the built environment for over 30 years and is committed to bringing equity to the communities where she works.

Here is what's special about Maia Small:

- She co-authored the San Francisco Urban Design Guidelines.
- Maia's parents designed and built her childhood home, even though they weren't architects! This was what initially sparked Maia's interest in design and construction.
- At 26, Maia led her first project, which was designing the first urban national park in Canada.






