President's Message





While financial sustainability remains our greatest challenge, it's also our greatest opportunity—to grow the circle of people who believe in what we do and the impact of architecture on our communities.

2025 has been a year of inspiration, connection, and meaningful progress for the California Architecture Foundation (CAF).

This year, CAF awarded \$56,780 in scholarships, supporting 19 individuals and 11 NAAB-accredited schools in California. These scholarships are more than financial aid—they are a vote of confidence and recognition of each recipient's potential. Since 1979, CAF has awarded more than \$625,000, and this year we are proud to bestow awards under the Mel Ferris Architectural Scholarship after a long hiatus.

The Foundation launched the new *California Architectural Practice Experience Program* (capX) statewide, connecting students to internships and job-shadow opportunities. Nearly half of the participants are from community colleges, alongside students from California State University (CSU), University of California (UC), private California universities, the experience-only path, and recent college graduates. Participation in capX grew significantly from our 2024 pilot, reflecting strong demand and interest in the value of real-world experiences.

CAF also expanded efforts to reach students long before they enter college, launching *Choose Architecture*, a California-focused career resource guide to help inspire young people see themselves in the profession, learn more about what an architect does, the pathways to licensure, and suggestions to learn more. CAF shared the guide and the Foundation's *Architecture by the Book* education program at the American School Counselor Association Conference in Long Beach, introducing architecture as a career pathway to more than 5,000 school counselors.

CAF gratefully assisted AIA California in supporting those impacted by the January Palisades and Eaton fires. Thanks to the generosity of donors, \$7,100 in fire recovery aid was disbursed to AIA Los Angeles and AIA Pasadena Foothill Chapters to support individual members and local efforts.

To strengthen community connections, the Foundation launched *CAF Corner*, a quarterly enewsletter, now reaching 453 subscribers, with impact stories and ways to engage.

In fundraising, our *First to Give* campaign more than tripled its goal, fueled by a matching gift from CAF Regents Scott Gaudineer, AIA, and Betsey Olenick Dougherty, FAIA. Altogether, CAF launched eleven fundraising campaigns that are either completed or still underway.



Chester & Diana Widom Architectural Education Scholarship

The Widom Scholarship was established in 2017 by Chet Widom, FAIA and his wife Diana Widom in honor of Paul Welch Jr., Hon AIA.

Robert J. Kain Healthcare Design Education Scholarship

The Kain Scholarship, established by AIA California's Healthcare Facilities Forum Planning Committee in memory of Robert J. Kain, AIA supports architecture students pursuing careers in hospital and healing environment design.

Mel Ferris Architectural Scholarship

The Mel Ferris Scholarship provides financial assistance to university level architectural students enrolled in accredited schools of architecture in California who have demonstrated financial need and exemplary academic and design achievements.

The scholarship is awarded in three tiers:

• First Place: \$5,000

• Second Place: \$4,000

• Third Place: \$3,000

Additionally, each of California's eleven NAAB accredited school of architecture will receive \$500 in 2025 to distribute to distinguished students.

Bridging Education & Practice capX Internship Program



The California Architectural Practice Experience Program (capX) serves to bridge the gap between architectural education and professional practice by connecting students and emerging architects with firms across California for internships, job shadowing, and community building. After a successful 2024 pilot, the program opened statewide in 2025.

capX achieved strong diversity and geographic representation, successfully engaging community colleges, the program's the largest participant segment. Enrollment reached 86 participants, surpassing the target of 50 and demonstrating significant student interest and demand for bridging educational and professional experiences.



Growing Architectural Awareness **K-12 Education**



Architecture by the Book brings architecture into classrooms and community spaces, introducing the profession and sparking curiosity about why design matters in daily life. Each lesson is centered on a children's book, a notable architect, or an architectural concept, and paired with an engaging presentation and a hands-on activity using recycled materials.

Designed to be completed in about 90 minutes, the program is impactful for students while remaining manageable for volunteers.

The program is steadily growing, with more volunteers, schools, and community partners participating each year.

Originally developed and piloted by AIA Central Valley, *Architecture by the Book* expanded statewide in 2024 through CAF with support from firm sponsorship, donors and a grant from the AIA College of Fellows.




Kids Draw Architecture, created in 1988 by the Architectural Foundation of Santa Barbara, connects architects with children and their families to foster early appreciation for the built environment.

In small groups, architects guide students through sketching exercises that help them observe architectural details and understand how buildings shape communities.

Since 2017, AIA chapters across California have hosted events, engaging thousands of students in hands-on experiences that make architecture more accessible and inspiring.


