President's Message

At its best, architecture is a profession built on people helping one another. Someone opens a door, offers advice, makes a connection, gives a little encouragement, or simply says, “You can do this.” The California Architectural Foundation (CAF) exists to make more of those moments possible, and I am proud of what we accomplished together this year.

The Foundation awarded \$39,500 in scholarships through the Kain, Welch, and Widom funds, providing meaningful support to deserving students when they need it most.

Our capX program had an important year. We rebuilt the online platform from the ground up and launched capX 2.0 with public student profiles, improved search and filtering for firms, and a growing resource library for mentors, including recordings of our annual Meetup sessions. We are also developing a new guide: *Design Your Own Path to Mentoring*, a resource to help small and mid-sized firms create meaningful opportunities to engage with emerging professionals in ways that benefit both.

We revised the *Choose Architecture* career guide to provide a clearer picture of the paths toward licensure, added a student debt resource page on the CAF website and, together with our friends at AIA Central Valley, published a statewide Architecture Coloring Book for kids of all ages. We are excited to have 135 volunteers supporting *Architecture by the Book*, our K-12 education program, and to have strong participation in AIA's Architecture Week.

Together, these programs address different points along the path into architecture, from sparking a child's curiosity, to supporting a student's education, to connecting an emerging professional with the people and experiences that can help launch a career. Growing that impact requires a strong Foundation behind it.

This year, I set out to encourage 100% participation from the AIA California Board of Directors and to expand CAF's donor community beyond those who already know and love this organization. We are making progress. Our Founder's Circle / 5x5 donors deserve special recognition for pledging \$25,000 over five years to help build CAF's future, along with our Legacy donors who are including CAF in their wills. If you have been considering making this kind of commitment, I would be happy to talk with you about it.

CAF has accomplished so much since our 2023 re-envisioning, and our momentum continues to build. Our greatest challenge remains financial sustainability, but I believe it is also an opportunity. CAF has a distinctive role to fill, and the more people who understand that role and invest in it, the more we can do to support the next generation and provide outreach to the public on value of architecture to society.

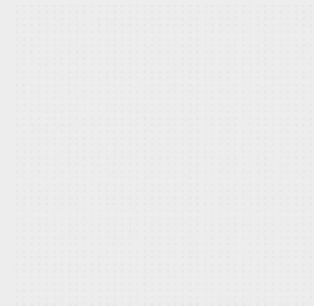

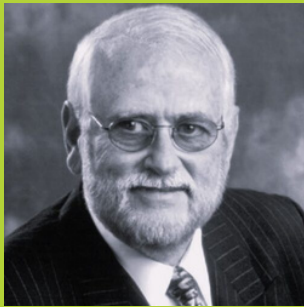

Chester & Diana Widom Architectural Education Scholarship

The Widom Scholarship was established in 2017 by Chet Widom, FAIA and his wife Diana Widom in honor of Paul Welch Jr., Hon AIA.

The scholarship provides financial support to community college students transferring to an accredited school of architecture. Scholarship recipients will receive up to \$5,000 to apply to qualified tuition and related expenses and to improve or enhance their capacity, skill, and talent while studying architecture.

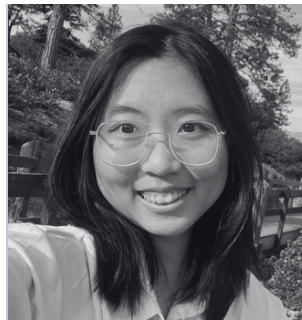

Robert J. Kain Healthcare Design Education Scholarship

The Kain Scholarship, established by AIA California's Healthcare Facilities Forum Planning Committee in memory of Robert J. Kain, AIA supports architecture students pursuing careers in hospital and healing environment design.

Scholarship recipients receive \$2,000 to help offset costs of higher education in architecture. The award can be used for qualified tuition and related expenses or to otherwise improve or enhance capacity, skill, or talent in the field of healthcare architecture.

Bridging Education & Practice

capX Internship Program



The California Architectural Practice Experience Program (capX) connects architecture students and early-career professionals with California firms for paid internships, job shadowing, and virtual mentoring to help build the next generation of licensed architects. capX began as a pilot in 2023 and launched statewide in 2025. To date 245 students, 44 firms, and 11 AIA Chapters have participated in this growing program.

This year CAF completely redesigned the capX online platform built around feedback from the capX community. The new capX 2.0 site features public-facing student profiles, improved search and filtering features, and a resource page offering tools and education to support mentorship.

capX Internship Program



capX connects people at every stage of their journey into architecture with firms and opportunities across California.

Firms are the heart of the program. Through mentoring, job shadowing, internships, and employment, they give participants something that education alone cannot: a firsthand connection to practice.

Every firm that participates helps turn potential into experience and strengthens the pathway into the profession. Growing that network means more people can take their next step with greater confidence, preparation, and connection.

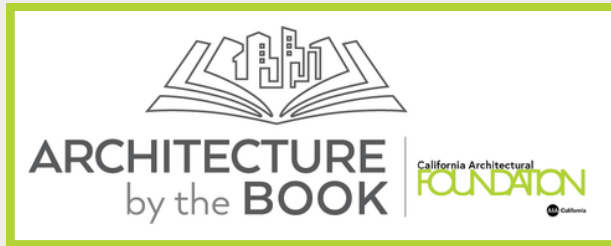

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Growing Architectural Awareness **K-12 Education**



Architecture by the Book brings architecture into classrooms and community spaces, introducing the profession and sparking curiosity about why design matters in daily life. Each lesson is centered on a children's book, a notable architect, or an architectural concept, and is paired with an engaging presentation and a hands-on activity using recycled materials.

Designed to be completed in about 90 minutes, the program is impactful for students while remaining manageable for volunteers.

The program is steadily growing, with more volunteers, schools, and community partners participating each year.

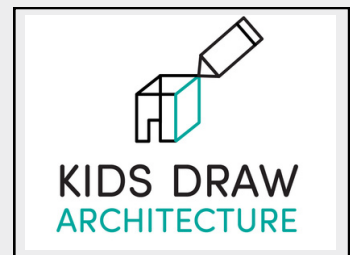

Growing Architectural Awareness K-12 Education



CAF inspires an interest in architecture through K-12 programs and resources that reach young people at every age, from a child's first sketch of a building to a high school student weighing a career path.

Choose Architecture is a California-focused guide that helps young people see themselves in the profession. It introduces what architects do, explores paths to licensure, and points readers toward ways to get started. Featuring insights from California architects, AIA California design award projects, and resources on education, internships, and scholarships, the guide gives students, educators, and families a starting point for exploring a future in architecture. The 2026 edition includes a newly revised section on pathways into the profession.

Kids Draw Architecture pairs small groups of students with practicing architects for sketching exercises that teach them to observe architectural details and see how buildings shape their communities. Created in 1988 by the Architectural Foundation of Santa Barbara, the program has been hosted by AIA chapters across California since 2017, engaging thousands of students.

New in 2026, the statewide **Architecture Coloring Book** offers another accessible way to discover architecture at any age. Each illustrated page introduces a building and architect while telling a story rooted in place, purpose, and people. Available through CAF in print and online.
